

The Pan-African Awards *for* Entrepreneurship in Education 2019

Terms & Conditions

1. Entry Criteria

1. The competition is open to all organizations with a focus on education located in one of the 55 African countries for which awards are available (see below).
2. Entries can be submitted on behalf on another organization – e.g. by non-African NGOs on behalf of their local partner / office – however prize monies and conference travel bursaries must be claimed by and used for the benefit of, the Africa-based organization itself.
3. The full list of African countries for which awards are available is as follows:
Algeria, Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo (Democratic Republic of the), Congo Brazzaville (also known as Republic of the Congo), Côte d'Ivoire (commonly known as Ivory Coast), Djibouti, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Libya, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Morocco, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Rwanda, São Tomé and Príncipe, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Somalia, South Africa, South Sudan, Sudan, Swaziland, Tanzania, Togo, Tunisia, Uganda, Western Sahara, Zambia, Zimbabwe
4. All entries must be accompanied by work contact details of a suitable referee who is able to confirm that the contents of the entry are a true and accurate representation of the entrant's work
5. Referees must be i) independent of your organisation and ii) either a government official, qualified professional, or senior employee of an internationally recognized institution.
6. Qualified professionals for the purpose of this competition include: teachers (employed by a different institution), doctors, lawyers, judges, accountants, bankers, engineers,



7. Referees cannot include family members of the entrant.
If you have any doubts about whether your referee meets these criteria please contact competitions@Teach A Man To Fish.org.uk prior to submitting an entry.

2. Conduct of the Competition

1. **The Saville Foundation Pan-African Awards for Entrepreneurship in Education 2019** is a one round competition running from Monday 27th May until Friday 16th August 2019.
2. Entries can be submitted through the website using the online competition entry form. Offline applications will not be accepted. Entries may be submitted in English or French. Competition entries received in other languages cannot be accepted.
3. To be considered, all entries must be received by **Teach A Man To Fish** on or before the competition close date. **Teach A Man To Fish** cannot be held responsible for any failure in postal or electronic transmission resulting in non-receipt of entries, or entries being received after the closing date.
4. Entrants are not required to become members of the **Teach A Man To Fish** Network in order to enter the competition
5. Membership of the **Teach A Man To Fish** Network and entry to the competition are completely free of charge.
6. **Teach A Man To Fish** reserves the right to amend the Terms & Conditions of the competition subsequent to the start date or to cancel it in its entirety. This prerogative will however only be used under exceptional circumstances and where no practicable alternative is available.
7. The selection criteria of winner will be made available through the website.

3. Use of Information

1. On submission, all entrants agree to be added to the **Teach A Man To Fish** contact list which entitles them to receive quarterly email newsletters and will be offered a chance to join as members of the **Teach A Man To Fish** Network. *Note: Entrants can be removed from this contact list at any point by clicking “unsubscribe” at the bottom of every newsletter email or by sending a blank email to info@Teach A Man To Fish.org.uk with the subject ‘unsubscribe’.*
2. By submitting an entry into the competition entrants are agreeing to allow **Teach A Man To Fish** and **The Saville Foundation** to use their stories as part of their online and offline communications in such a manner as they sees fit.
3. **Teach A Man To Fish** and **The Saville Foundation** will not share contact and personal details of entrants on a commercial basis with any 3rd parties.

4. Winners

1. A prize of USD \$15,000 is available to the best entry overall as well as two prizes of
2. \$5,000 for the best runners-up.
3. Entrants will be shortlisted by late August 2019. Shortlisted entrants will be invited to apply for the partner prize of \$5,000 that comes with the opportunity to work with Teach A Man To Fish's global programme The School Enterprise Challenge. Prize money for the Future Partner Prize winner will only be transferred once a memorandum of understanding (MoU) between the winning organisation and **Teach A Man To Fish** has been signed.
4. The use of prize money is at the discretion of the recipient organization. **To receive the prize the winning organizations will require a bank account in the name of that organization and must be able to accept international money transfers.**
5. The full list of award winners will be announced in September 2019.
6. Disbursement of funds is to be contingent on the submission of relevant proofs required and verification of these documents along with the achievements described in winning entries.
7. Teach A Man To Fish can not be held responsible for prize winners sending incorrect or insufficient bank details. Transfers will be made only when sufficient details have been given, and Teach A Man To Fish can not be responsible for issues regarding the prize funds reaching the beneficiary after the money has left the Teach A Man To Fish bank account.
8. Due to fluctuations in exchange rates, Teach A Man To Fish can not be held responsible for the amount of prize money the is received by the beneficiary. Teach A Man To Fish endeavours to send the correct amount of prize money stated in the competition details but can not be held liable for any differences between the stated amount and the final amount received.
9. Apart from the initial fee charged by Teach A Man To Fish's bank account to transfer prize funds, any further fees that are incurred due to payments being sent back to our bank account or other payment process issues that are not the fault of Teach A Man To Fish will be the liability of the beneficiary and will be deducted from the initial prize fund amount.
10. Winning entrants will be required to provide evidence of their organization's legal status (e.g. registration documents) and annual accounts.
11. Prizes may not be received before December 2019.
12. By entering this competition you are consenting to allow representatives from **Teach A Man To Fish** to verify in person, where so deemed necessary, the truthfulness of any entry submitted, and to allow stories and images to be gathered for communications purposes. This might ordinarily take the form of visits to the organizations field operations/headquarters and to those of their referee.

5. Jury and Selection Procedure

1. **Teach A Man To Fish** retains full responsibility for the composition of the jury.
2. The jury is fully and solely responsible for the final selection of the winning entries. There will be no correspondence about the jury's final decision.
3. Although the competition is open to all organizations based in Africa working in education, preference will be given in the judging stages to organizations which are legally registered in the relevant country, which have been in existence for more than two years, and which are able and willing to provide financial accounts.
4. **Teach A Man To Fish** and the jury at all times have the right to disqualify a participant, without the obligation to state the reasons.

6. Liability and Conflicts

1. **Teach A Man To Fish** will not be liable for any claims regarding the procedure or selection of the winning entries.
2. All conflicts will be made available for judgment to the **Teach A Man To Fish** Board of Trustees.
