# TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

# **Trash to Cash Challenge 2022**

#### 1. Entry criteria

- a. Entry is free of charge.
- b. The competition is open to all young people, aged 25 or younger, in any country.
- c. Young people can participate individually or in teams of maximum 5 students.
- d. The participants must be 25 or younger, but teachers of all ages are welcome to support the participants.

#### 2. Submission requirements

- a. To participate, you must complete the Submission Form. It will be available on the Trash to Cash page of the Teach A Man To Fish website:

- b. Teams may submit a maximum of one entry.
- c. For the Public Choice prize, you will have to create and submit a video. Please refer to the Technical Requirements section below for more information.
- d. To prove eligibility for the prizes of Most Trash Converted into Products, Most Creative Repurpose of Waste and Most Sales Made, you are required to provide video or photographic evidence of your achievements and include it in the Submission Form.
- e. Each individual/team can only win one prize.
- f. Incomplete entries or entries that do not comply with these Terms and Conditions will be disqualified.
- g. Submissions may also not be accepted into the contest if the video entry submitted features an identifiable individual who has not given their consent to appear or if the image features advertising or trademarks which would require Teach A Man To Fish to obtain permission to use.

## 3. Technical requirements

- a. Submissions are encouraged to contain the following:
  - Photographic evidence of 1) the amount of trash collected, 2) the product(s) you created from the trash collected, 3) you selling the product(s) and 4) your sales records, showing how many products you sold, the price(s) you sold them for and the total income generated.
  - The posting of an original video clip on social media is required to participate in the Public Choice prize. The video must last 2 minutes or less, and it must show the waste collected, the product created and the process of selling it. Only <u>one video</u> is permitted per individual or team, but you can submit through the Submission Form up to 20 links of the

<u>same video</u> posted in your own social media accounts on different platforms (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and TikTok). The video posted in social media must be set to <u>public mode</u> using the <u>#TrashToCashChallenge</u>. On Instagram, the video must be posted as a reel or a video displayed in the feed, not an Instagram story.

 You must have full copyrights to the submitted material, including sound effects and music if used. Competition submissions must not include any obscene, violent, racist or defamatory content.

# 4. Judging criteria and prizes

- a. Teach A Man To Fish retains full responsibility for the composition of the judging panel which will be solely responsible for the final selection of the prize winning entries. There will be no correspondence about the judging panel's final decision.
- b. The judging panel will look for creative, innovative and inspiring submissions.
- c. There are 4 prize categories:
  - 1) Most trash converted into products: USD 300 (awarded by judging panel).
  - 2) Most creative repurpose of waste: USD 300 (awarded by judging panel).
  - 3) Most sales made: USD 300 (awarded by judging panel).
  - 4) Most social media 'likes' on video: USD 300 (public choice). For the 'likes' to be counted, you must include up to 20 link(s) in the Submission Form of the video posted on your own social media platforms (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and TikTok).
- d. The judging panel reserves the right to consider mitigating circumstances where appropriate.
- e. The judging panel reserves the right to make no award in a given category if insufficient entries are received or entries are not of sufficient quality.
- f. Teach A Man To Fish and the judging panel at all times have the right to disqualify a participant, without the obligation to state the reasons. Teach A Man To Fish has the right to withhold payment to a prize winner if subsequent due diligence checks reveal the winner to be ineligible.
- g. Prize winners will be announced publicly in July 2022, however the prize winners may be contacted prior to this.
- h. Disbursement of funds is to be contingent on the submission of relevant proofs required and verification of these documents along with the achievements described in winning entries.
- i. Prize funds will only be disbursed to a registered bank account in the name of the participant or a parent/guardian of a participant.
- j. The process for disbursal of monetary prizes is expected to begin <u>from September 2022</u>, after successful completion of the aforementioned reference checks, and may not be completed before the end of 2022. Any supporting documentation requested by Teach A Man To Fish must be provided by 31 October 2022 at the latest, after which time prize money will be deemed 'unclaimed' and re-allocated.
- k. Prize values may be subject to change based on exchange rate fluctuations and international transfer fees.
- I. By entering this programme you are consenting to allow representatives from Teach A Man To Fish and/or its donors to verify in person, where so deemed necessary, the truthfulness of any

entry submitted, and to allow stories and images to be gathered for communications purposes.

#### 5. Child Protection

- a. Teach A Man To Fish strongly encourages adult supervision (for example from a teacher or parent/guardian) for participants under 18 years old.
- b. In relation to business activities Teach A Man To Fish believes that young people's wellbeing overrides all other considerations, particularly business profit. The health, safety and welfare of all those participating in the Trash To Cash Challenge is of primary concern at all times. Participating in the Trash To Cash Challenge must be in no way detrimental to students' studies in any other area.
- c. No participants should run a business for learning and income-generating purposes that puts children at risk of exploitation, at risk of harm to children's health or education, at risk of danger (that is not mitigated) or which contravenes local labour law. It is the responsibility of the school and the parents/guardians to make sure that adequate measures are taken to protect children from harm when business activities involve potentially dangerous activities including, but not limited to, heavy lifting and exposure to chemicals.
- d. Participants are not permitted to set up businesses including, but not limited to, alcohol, drugs, gambling, firearms or nudity. This list is not exhaustive and entrants are expected to ensure that the businesses they set up do not harm the health, safety and welfare of participants. Teach A Man To Fish reserves the right to disqualify entrants whose businesses it deems to be exploitative, dangerous or illegal and to notify relevant local authorities.
- e. By accepting our terms and conditions and entering into the Trash To Cash Challenge you accept the aforementioned Child Protection recommendations. You also allow Teach A Man To Fish to use any photographs or videos that you have shared with us in our own publications and social media and you confirm that you have consent from the children featured in those photographs/videos and their parents/guardian/ or the NGO responsible for them (if required by local law) to use those photographs or videos.

## 6. Use of Information

- 1. By completing the Submission Form of the Trash To Cash Challenge, all entrants agree automatically to be added to the Trash To Cash Challenge contact lists, which entitles them to receive email updates throughout the duration of the challenge.
- 2. By completing the Submission Form of the Trash To Cash Challenge, all entrants agree automatically to be added to our partners' contact lists, which entitles them to receive future information about any competitions/promotions that these organisations are running. Teach A Man To Fish reserves the right to add more key partners in the future and share where appropriate any contact details of participants.

- 3. Participants confirm they have sought appropriate levels of consent in line with their local laws (e.g. consent from young people and their parents/guardians), which allow Teach A Man To Fish to use photos and information submitted to us as part of their online and offline communications in such a manner as they see fit. This includes but is not limited to the use of any photographs taken and case studies, to be shared for example on the Teach A Man To Fish and School Enterprise Challenge websites, social media, newsletters, funding proposals and other publications.
- 4. Teach A Man To Fish will not share contact and personal details of entrants on a commercial basis with any 3<sup>rd</sup> parties who are not our partners. Where it is considered by us to be to the entrant's advantage to share such details with members of the Teach A Man To Fish Network we reserve the right to do so.
- 5. The Teach A Man To Fish and Trash To Cash Challenge logos cannot be used to demonstrate endorsement by Teach A Man To Fish, or for fundraising purposes, unless previously agreed in writing by a Senior Manager from Teach A Man To Fish.

# 8. Liability and Conflicts

- a. It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure that their entry conforms to any legal restrictions regarding enterprise activity placed upon young people or in general.
- b. It is the responsibility of participants to ensure that they conform to any legal requirements, including but not limited to, health and safety regulations associated with the business activities they will be undertaking as part of their entry for the Trash To Cash Challenge.
- c. It is the responsibility of participants to ensure that they have adequate and appropriate insurance cover in relation to the business activities they will be undertaking as part of their entry for the Trash To Cash Challenge.
- d. Teach A Man To Fish accepts no liability for any injury that may occur as a result of staff or young people participating in activities related to the Trash To Cash Challenge.
- e. Teach A Man To Fish accepts no responsibility or liability for any losses or damage suffered by the participants as a result of setting up a business.
- f. Teach A Man To Fish will not be liable for any claims regarding the procedure or selection of the winning entries.
- g. All conflicts will be made available for judgement to the Teach A Man To Fish Board of Trustees
